## Discover the question

**Level:** A2.1, A2.2, B1.1

**Age:** 10-12

**Organization:** whole class

Aims: To guess or deduce a question from given answers.

**Language focus**: *In the example:* past simple, statements and questions

Alternatives: present simple, statements and questions in any tense

Materials: Essential: none

## **Procedure**

- 1. Ask two children to come and sit at the front of the class with their back to the board and facing the other children.
- 2. Write a question on the board, e.g. What did you do last weekend? Without the two children at the front seeing it.
- 3. Ask the rest of the class to think about a sentence to say in answer to the question. The children at the front then point to and name several children who tell them their answers, e.g. *I did my homework*. / *I went to the park*. / *I watched TV*. / *I read a comic*.
- 4. After listening to the answers, the children at the front try to guess the question on the board. Be ready to prompt with a word or two if necessary.
- 5. Repeat the procedure several times with different children and questions.

## **Comments and Suggestions**

- In this activity children are encouraged to actively listen out for 'grammar' as this is the key to guessing the question correctly.
- The questions you use in the activity can be graded in difficulty to suit the level of the children, e.g. How do you come to school? What's your favourite food? Where are you going on holiday?
