

**Narrator:** A2+ End-of-year Test. Part 1.

Listen and choose the correct picture for each question. Choose A, B or C. You will hear each conversation twice.

**Narrator:** Before we start, here is an example. Where do they decide to go?

**Boy:** What shall we do this evening?

**Girl:** I'd like to go to the concert. Diego López is playing at the Round House.

**Boy:** That's a nice idea but the tickets are expensive. We could go to the cinema ... there's a film about basketball that I want to see.

**Girl:** Well, I'd like to go to the cinema but I don't want to see that film. Let's see something different.

**Boy:** OK.

**Narrator:** The correct answer is B. Now we are ready to start.

**Narrator:** 1 What must Auntie Anne do this evening?

**Woman:** Um ... Serena. It's Auntie Anne. I've just called your mum but she didn't answer her phone. We've arranged to go out for dinner this evening but I have to work late at the office so I can't go out. I've got an important meeting tomorrow. Can you tell her please? Thanks ... bye.

**Man:** The school trip is next Thursday. It's going to be cold and wet there ... so you must bring the right clothes. You need to bring a jacket and a warm sweater but I don't recommend jeans ... if they get wet, you'll be very uncomfortable ... Now, you don't have to bring lunch because we'll be home before lunchtime ... Are there any questions?

**Girl:** That's the old man who I helped yesterday.

**Boy:** Oh right ... so how did you help him?

**Girl:** Well, he was walking across the road and his shopping bag broke. I picked up some of the food for him and we put it in another bag. I offered to carry the things to his car but he said he was OK.

**Boy:** Did he thank you?

**Girl:** Yes, he did ... and he gave me some chocolate!

**Eric:** Hey Vanessa, how do you feel about the exams?

**Vanessa:** I don't know ... I worked hard but they were really difficult.

**Eric:** I know what you mean ... I'm not worried about maths but I'm nervous about the French exam ... I'm not very good at languages.

**Vanessa:** Oh, I don't mind French ... I think science was my worst exam.

**Eric:** Yes, it was quite difficult ... but it wasn't as hard as French.

**Narrator:** You will hear a boy asking for information in a sports centre. Listen and choose the correct answer, A, B or C.

**Man:** Good morning. How can I help you?

**Boy:** Hello. I'd like some information about the sports centre ... I'm thinking about joining.

**Man:** OK. Have you been here before?

**Boy:** Yes, I've been in the swimming pool but I haven't seen the other parts of the sports centre.

**Man:** Right ... well, there's a modern gymnasium with a lot of exercise machines. It's open from seven until ten on weekdays and from seven until eight at weekends ... There are also courts for squash and tennis ...

**Boy:** When can I use the squash courts?

**Man:** They're open all day but you need to reserve them ... They're very popular so it's a good idea to reserve them at least seven days before you want to play.

**Boy:** Are there any classes?

**Man:** Yes, there are. We have aerobics classes every morning and dance classes in the afternoons.

**Boy:** What type of dance class are they?

**Man:** Well, we have a different type of dance class every month. Last month we had flamenco classes and this month it's salsa. We've also had disco dancing but it wasn't very popular.

**Boy:** That sounds interesting ... How many people are in the classes?

**Man:** We don't have more than fifty but there are usually less than that. Most of the classes have between fifteen and twenty people in them.

**Boy:** So how much does it cost to join?

**Man:** Well ... it's twenty five euros a month for adults and it's free for children under five.

**Boy:** Oh ... I'm a student ... is there a discount for students?

**Man:** Actually, there is. Students get a discount of ten euros ... so it'll be fifteen euros for you.

**Boy:** That sounds great. I think I'll join ...
